

**DRUMLINS II APPROVED PLANT LIST**  
**March 2020**

This list of trees and shrubs should be used as a guide for plantings around the homeowner's property. In order to maintain the appearance of our community and enable easy landscape maintenance, plants should not have messy seeds or droppings (berries), nor be invasive, and should be deer resistant to some degree. The Drumlins II HOA does replace damaged and/or dead plants and uses this list as a guide. (Note: costly or exotic plants would be replaced with a selection from this list) The plants listed are reasonably priced. The HOA would replace a mature plant with a younger, and generally smaller and less expensive plant. A homeowner may choose to supplement the cost of the HOA's replacement plant in order to have a larger, more mature plant.
