**Re: Town of Perinton Residential Refuse Policy & Collection Map**

Dear Resident:

We are pleased to provide you with the Town of Perinton's updated **Residential Refuse Policy**, enclosed with this letter. The policy outlines our refuse collection program "do's and don'ts," helps minimize duplication of services between the town and private garbage/trash disposal companies, and mitigates the safety hazards and unsightliness associated with debris placed in the public right-of-way. Please note this program remains free to all residential properties in Perinton.

Additionally, we are implementing a new "quadrant" based collection schedule. Enclosed is a **Refuse Collection Map**, which shows the town divided into four quadrants or areas. Residents in each area will have the same collection day, Monday through Thursday of each week. This approach is more efficient and cost-effective as it will allow the town, private disposal companies and WM Recycle America, who provides town-wide recycling services, to focus our collection activities on one area of the town each day. Please refer to the map to see which quadrant your home is located in, as your collection day may have changed. The town, private disposal companies and WM Recycle America will all continue to collect on the same day.

**Our new collection schedule will begin on April 1<sup>st</sup> 2019.** Please take a moment to review the updated policy, map and your collection day. Please also remember to place all loose materials in reusable containers without lids. This helps keep our collection activities clean and safe. Our trucks each make approximately 500 stops and collect over 20,000 pounds of material a day. As a reminder, the town's program is intended to assist residents with common residential tree and landscaping debris, household metal products like appliances, small amounts of dirt, stone, and concrete, as well as tires (4 per year per property); all of which are generated by routine residential property maintenance activities. For large-scale projects involving commercial contractors that result in significant amounts of tree or landscaping debris, we ask residents to have their contractor(s) remove and dispose of the materials as part of their services. We appreciate your cooperation and thank you for working with us to "help keep Perinton clean."

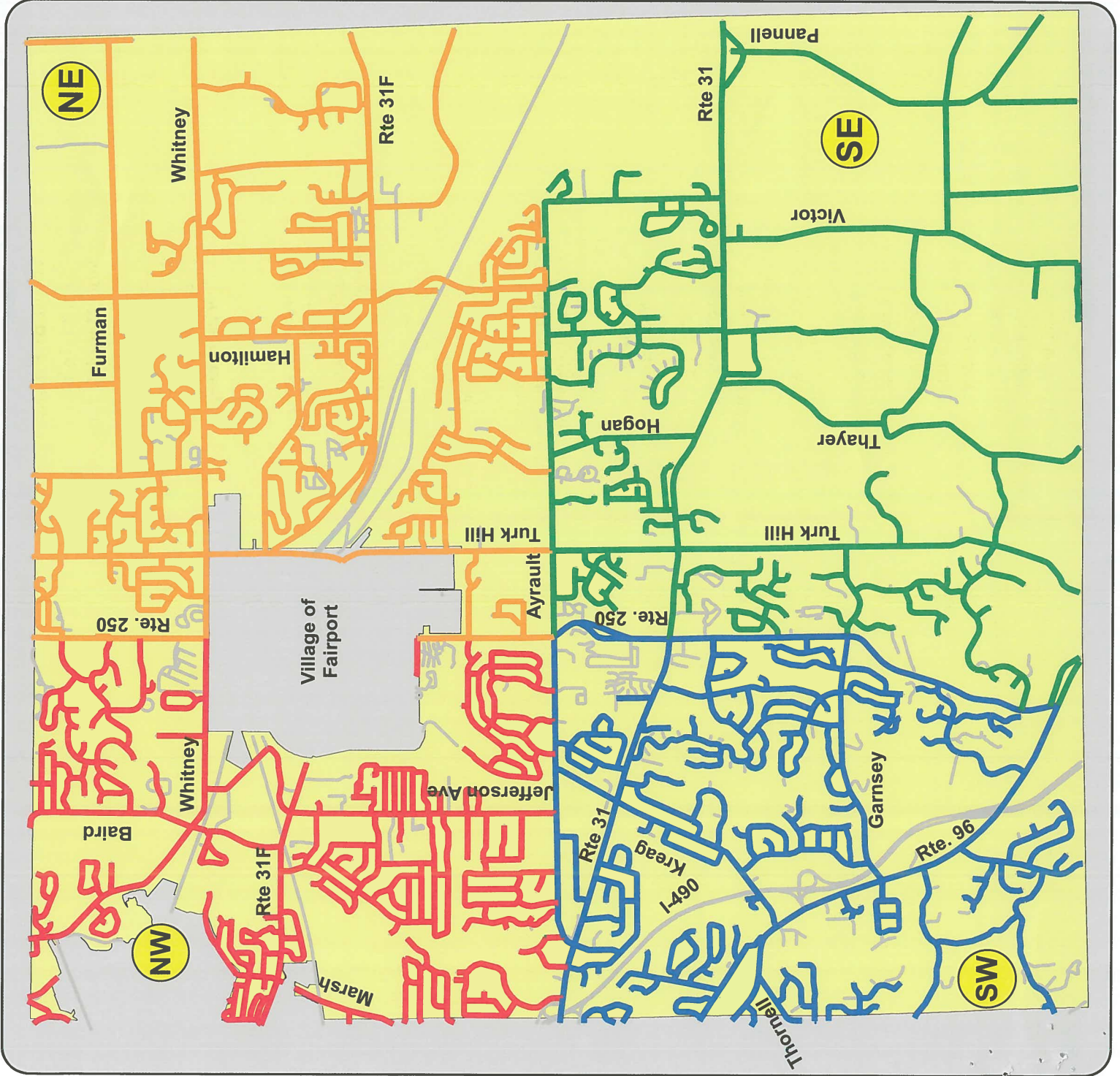

### Items Collected by Private Haulers —

(May require a special request if in addition to weekly pickup)

- ◇ Household garbage & Recycling
- ◇ Building debris
- ◇ Wood fencing, lumber, cabinets, ladders etc.
- ◇ Furniture, mattresses, carpeting
- ◇ Toilets

### Items Requiring Special Handling—

- ◇ Railroad ties, utility poles: *Alpco Recycling (800) 706-9449 or (315) 986-8900*
- ◇ Grass clippings: *Composting recommended*
- ◇ Household Hazardous Waste: *Monroe County ECO Park, www.monroecounty.gov/hhw. (Also watch for May event at DPW)*
- ◇ Electronic waste: *Residents may drop off at Town of Perinton DPW (Fees apply for CRT items)*

### NOT ACCEPTED by DPW —

- ◇ Grass clippings
- ◇ Bags of any kind with yard debris
- ◇ No loose material (except leaves & branches)
- ◇ Toters or wheelbarrows containing yard debris
- ◇ Containers weighing more than 50 lbs.
- ◇ Material generated from home construction

### Important Notes—

- ◇ Town crews attempt to remove all debris from property without any damage occurring. However, at times, large amounts of material placed on your lawn may cause minor damage during the collection process. **Any damage that occurs is the homeowner's responsibility.**
- ◇ Materials shall not be placed at the roadside for collection more than 24 hours in advance of the scheduled collection day. (Loose leaf pickup is an exception).

## Town of Perinton Residential Refuse Policy Acceptable Materials for Pick Up

**All loose material (except leaves) must be in reusable containers (i.e., garbage cans) without lids, 50 lbs. or less per container (picked up weekly, weather permitting)**

### Yard Waste—

- ◇ Weeds, garden material, fruit, leaves, and small yard debris (sticks)
- ◇ Leaves (loose) *Fall and Spring: Expect 4-6 week cycle for pick-up. No sticks or other debris mixed into pile*

### Tree Debris—

Please don't mix sod, stumps, rocks, lumber or other waste in with yard debris

- ◇ Small amount of brush, tree limbs, firewood, wood-chips, stump grindings
- ◇ Medium amount of tree debris (*about the size of an average desk*), stumps less than 12" in diameter, Christmas trees: place parallel to road, at edge of property, not in gutter or road (pickup estimate of one to three weeks)
- ◇ Large amount of tree debris (*about the size of a mid-size car*) pickup estimate of one to three weeks
- ◇ No Contractor Piles (Any debris generated by a contractor must be removed as part of their service)

### Stone, Dirt, Concrete, Asphalt —

- ◇ Keep separate from other yard debris
- ◇ Small amounts
- ◇ No Contractor Piles (Material generated by a contractor must be removed as part of their service)

### Appliances & Other Items—

- ◇ Washers, dryers, stoves, metal bathtubs, sinks
- ◇ Refrigerators (doors removed)
- ◇ Air conditioners, dehumidifiers, furnaces
- ◇ Rims, empty propane cylinders
- ◇ Gas or charcoal grills
- ◇ Posts and pipes cut to 4' lengths
- ◇ Car parts, lawn mowers, tires (4 per household per year)
