

## WOODBURY PLACE - APPROVED PLANT LIST

Dear Homeowner:

This is a list of plants that the Landscape Committee has prepared to help you choose plants appropriate for your landscape. We encourage you to consult this list if: 1) the HOA is removing and replacing plant material due to the dead, dying or diseased condition of existing plants in your landscape, and a replacement is needed; or 2) you are planning new landscape plantings at homeowner's expense. (Just as a reminder, any changes to the outside of your home, including landscaping, require a variance approved by the Board.)

For each plant, the list includes: common name, botanical name, size at maturity, growth rate, growing conditions, care assessment, deer resistance, pruning guidelines and the color of needles, leaves, flowers and fruit.

Most of the plants listed are already in our landscape so you can see them in situ. A house number, berm or island location is indicated in parentheses after the plant name. This is the location where a specimen of the plant can be seen. Some of the plants listed are not currently in our landscape but are worthy of consideration. These are marked with an \*. There is also a list of plants that are considered inappropriate for our Woodbury landscape.

This list may change over time and updates will be posted on-line when that happens.

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

Upright-rounded, stoloniferous,          broadleaf evergreen shrub in the holly family. It can          spread by root suckers to form colonies. 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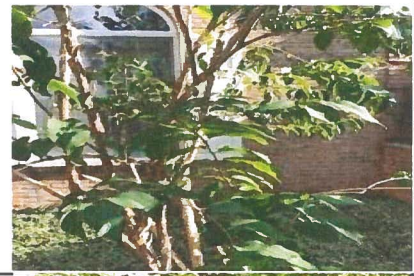

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<p>13 Pieris-(23; 68) <i>Pieris japonica</i>, several varieties  9' x 6' - slow growth rate  Full/part sun; moist, acid, well-drained soil new growth  Easy care; deer resistant Easy to prune;  glossy bronze; green in summer; white or pink flowers</p>

<p>17 Fothergilla (68)  Fothergilla gardenia  3' x 3' - slow growth rate  Full/part sun; well-drained soil  Easy care; deer resistant. Easy to prune; green leaves  in summer, brilliant yellow, orange, scarlet in fall;  white bottle-brush shaped flowers, honey scented</p>	
<p>18 Hydrangea (45)  Hydrangea macrophylla, several varieties  6' x 6' - fast growth rate full to part sun; moist,  well drained soil. Medium care; deer resistant  Prune after flowering as new buds form on old wood  Green leaves; blue or pink (depending on soil acidity),  large mop-head</p>

<p>26 Weigela (island before bridge) <i>Weigela florida</i>,        several varieties 6' x 9' - medium growth rate        Full sun; well-drained soil; very adaptable        Medium care; deer resistant, Prune after flowering to        keep in shape Medium green leaf;        white, pink or red flowers</p>

<p>27 Dogwood (14, side)  <i>Cornus florida</i> Rutgers hybrid, 'Stella Pink' &amp; 'Stella White'        20' x 15'- medium growth rate. Partial shade        - acid, well-drained soil with sufficient organic matter        Easy care; deer resistant. Occasional discrete pruning        when mature The Rutgers hybrids are not susceptible to        anthracnose disease. Dark green leaves in summer, red to        purple in fall; pink or white flowers depending on variety</p>	
<p>28 Kousa Dogwood (36, side) <i>Cornus kousa</i>        20' x 20' - slow growth rate        Full/partial sun; well-drained soil w/ organic matter.        Easy care; deer resistant. Occasional discrete pruning        when mature Dark green leaves in summer, red to        purple in fall; creamy white flowers;        red fruit (can be messy when it falls)</p>	
<p>29 Star Magnolia-(small: 45; island at 36-39) <i>Magnolia stellate</i>        20' x 15' or larger - slow rate of growth Full sun/light shade;        moist, deep, acid soil supplemented with peat        Medium care; deer resistant. Occasional discrete pruning        when mature and maybe cabling large limbs. Dark green        leaves in summer often yellow to bronze in fall;        white flowers; fragrant</p>	
<p>30 Serviceberry (4)- <i>Amelanchier arborea</i>        25' x 20' - medium rate of growth        Full/part sun; many types of soil        Easy care; deer resistant, Rarely needs pruning        Medium to dark green leaves in summer; yellow,        apricot, orange, red in fall; purplish black berries</p>	

- 31 Seven-sons tree (30) - *Heptacodium miconioides*  
 20' x 10' - slow growth rate  
 Sun to part sun - average soil  
 Easy care; deer resistant - Requires no pruning  
 Green leaves; white flowers; peeling bark



- 32 *Styrax* - American Snowbell (30) *Styrax americanus*  
 8' x 6' - Medium growth rate  
 Full or part shade; acid, well-drained soil  
 supplemented with peat moss or organic matter  
 Easy care; deer resistant - Easy to prune  
 Bright green leaves, white bell-shaped



**ORNAMENTAL NON-FLOWERING TREES**

- 33 Japanese Maple (18, rear) *Acer palmatum*  
 25' x 25'+, slow rate of growth Dappled shade; moist,  
 high organic matter, well-drained soil  
 Easy care; deer resistant-Occasional discrete pruning when  
 mature Green or purple in summer becoming bronze,  
 purple or red in the fall



- 34 Japanese Maple (small specimen tree) (11, 63, 64)  
*Acer palmatum dissectum* 8' x 8'  
 Slow rate of growth Full/partial sun; moist, high organic  
 matter, well-drained soil, Easy care; deer resistant  
 Occasional discrete pruning when mature. Green or  
 purple depending on variety  
 (green leaf varieties turn yellow-gold to red in fall)



- 35 Paperbark Maple - (66) *Acer griseum* 30' x 15'  
 Slow rate of growth  
 Full sun; well-drained moist soil but is adaptable  
 Easy care; deer resistant, Occasional discrete pruning  
 when mature Bluish green leaves in summer  
 changing to bronze or russet-red in fall



**EVERGREEN TREES**

- 36 Swiss Stone Pine (island at 57-62) *Pinus cembra*  
 40' x 25' - slow rate of growth  
 Full sun; well-drained loamy, slightly acid soil  
 Easy care; deer resistant  
 Rarely needs pruning; dark green needles

Western Arborvitae (50, side)

*Thuja standishii* x *plicata* 'Green Giant'  
70' x 25' - fast rate of growth, easy care  
deer resistant (so far). No pruning necessary  
but a light trim any time of year will encourage  
dense growth Green in summer, slightly bronzy in winter



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\* Chinese Juniper

2-40' tall x 15-20' wide

Soil: moist, well drained - Bloom time=Spring  
Yellow to bronze flower(no ornamental value)
